Since then it has grown into an evangelistic organisation that plants churches and operates development projects in other provinces of Cambodia. Together with fellow founders and lay workers, we see how God enabled us to undertake activities that have increased the capacity and capability of SMC to pursue its mission and goals.

Prior to the setting up of SMC, I was working as Country Coordinator for Cambodian Mission for Christ. Then I moved around a number of roles in World Vision which encompassed the following roles: Staff Capacity Building Coordinator, Christian Witness Initiative Project Manager and Christian Commitment Programme Manager for almost seven years. Currently I am also an advisor to Good Neighbour International Cambodia on Holistic Leadership Development.
